To install it in a Windows system, use winRAR. (Un)pack it into the folder c:\windows\system32\cmd. The y command gets the last mod time and the x command gets the first mod time. \*Screenshot via Gizmodo\* What is the drawback?. The program doesn't know about the ZIP format and will be unable to remove all but the first and last entry from a ZIP archive. So if you pack the files into a ZIP archive and then pack the ZIP archive into another ZIP archive, the program will only remove the first and last entry. I'm using the 64 bit version. It is, however, not available for Windows XP, Windows 2000 or Mac OS 8 or later. The health of patients with acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) can be improved through the use of highly active antiretroviral therapy (HAART). The central nervous system (CNS) is a target for several drug-resistant human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) variants, which can affect the efficacy of HAART. In a review paper in the journal HIV Medicine, researchers from China and the US examine several problems of HAART for the CNS, such as cerebral HIV-associated encephalitis (HIVE) and HAT dementia. HIVE and HAT dementia are the most common conditions caused by CNS infection. HIVE can be associated with serious, progressive cognitive, motor, and/or behavioral deterioration in patients with AIDS. HAT dementia is caused by progressive damage to the central nervous system, such as cognitive and motor deficits, caused by a neurotropic strain of HIV. The group, led by Dr Yulin Guo from the Guangzhou Institute of Respiratory Diseases, Guangzhou, China, reviewed the literature on HIVE and HAT dementia, as well as problems associated with HIVE in treatment-naïve patients. According to the review, HIVE is a life-threatening complication of HIV infection, with an incidence of approximately 20%, and HAT 82157476af
